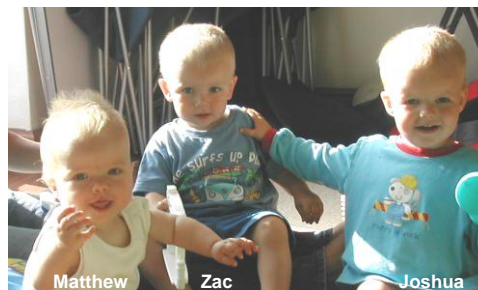
Christmas 2007
